

“Sons of God”

Always Referred to as Angels?
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Excerpt from Apples of Gold

“A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver.” Proverbs 25:11

Scripture uniformly teaches that angels are all *created* beings.

Moreover, if angels do not reproduce angels – why do some suppose they can produce men?

Matthew 22:30 For in the resurrection they neither marry, nor are given in marriage, but are as the angels (i.e., all sons) of God in heaven.

Nowhere in all of Scripture are fallen angels ever called “*sons of God*”.

Exodus 4:22 And thou shalt say unto Pharaoh, Thus saith the LORD, Israel is my son, even my firstborn:

Deuteronomy 14:1 Ye are the *children* of the LORD your God: ...

Job 1:6 Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan came also among them. (Job 2:1 says the same)

Psalms 82:6 I have said, Ye are gods; and all of you are children of the most High.

Isaiah 43:6 I will say to the north, Give up; and to the south, Keep not back: bring my sons from far, and my daughters from the ends of the earth; (context = Israel)

Hosea 1:10 Yet the number of the children of Israel shall be as the sand of the sea, which cannot be measured nor numbered; and it shall come to pass, that in the **place where it was said unto them, Ye are not my people, there it shall be said unto them, Ye are the *sons* of the living God.**

Luke 3:38 ... *Adam*, which was *the son* of *God*.

Fallen angels are referred to as fallen stars & the dragon’s angels (Rev. 12), unclean spirits, devils, foul spirits, evil spirits (demons).
